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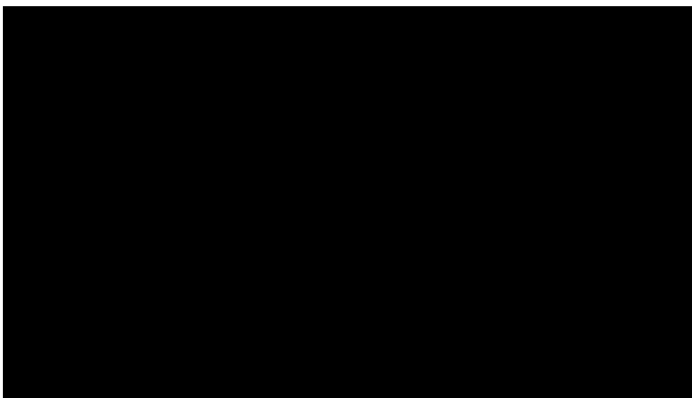
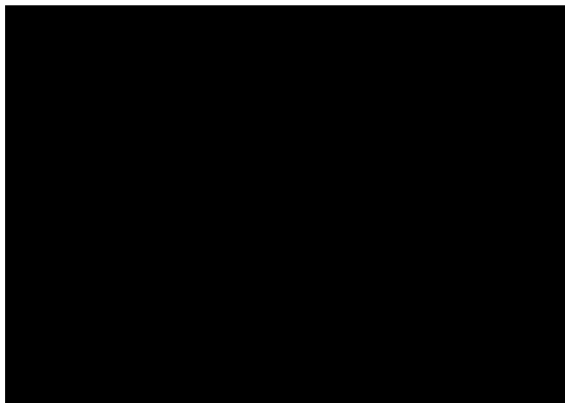


ILLUSTRATION OF THE CHEST FOR TŌFUKUJI TRANSMISSION ROBES

The transmission robe chest (*den'e bako* 伝衣箱) shown opposite is held at Tōfukuji 東福寺, Kyoto, and dates from 1677. It contains the five robes (*kāṣāya*) discussed and illustrated in the article by Yamakawa Aki below. The five *kāṣāya* and their chest are designated Japanese Important Cultural Properties.
