

In the early twentieth century, The Eastern Buddhist journal pioneered the presentation of Buddhism to the west and encouraged the west's engagement in interpretation. This interactive process increased dramatically in the post-war period, when dialogue between Buddhist and Christian thought began to take off in earnest. These debates attracted not only Zen voices but also thinkers from the Shin Buddhist tradition. Listening to Shin Buddhism brings together a range of classic writings from the 1950s to the 1970s that have significantly influenced subsequent Buddhist-Christian dialogue.



In the wide range of Buddhist meditation and spirituality a very special place is held by the practice of calling on the name of Amitabha, or Amida Buddha, using the nenbutsu. This book draws on classic articles, first published in The Eastern Buddhist, to introduce the major historic proponents and masters of the nenbutsu. Further contributions, which set the work of these masters into the wider context of Buddhist tradition, are some of the earliest Buddhist voices to emerge from modern Japan into global view. Yet the presentations of writers such as Sasaki Gessho, Yamabe Shugaku and Sugihira Shizutoshi have a freshness and an immediacy that speaks to us today.
