# *Monumenta* *Nipponica*

Recent issues of MN have contained a wide variety of articles about Japanese culture. They include studies on the mural paintings of Nagoya Castle, the rise and decline of Obama port, the art of Kaburaki Kiyokata, the liberal critic Hasegawa Nyozeikan, the search for the elusive Himiko, female self-writing, the Dōjōji illustrated scroll about a monk and a jealous woman, and the Imperial Oath of 1868.

In addition, last year the journal reviewed some sixty new books on Japanese history, literature, poetry, art, theater, education, and religion, and also included a complete index of MN volumes 1-50.

Future issues will run articles on Murasaki Shikibu and Mishima, poetry and painting in gozan Zen, artists in wartime, Zenchiku and Zeami, *Oku no Hosomichi*, Arakida Hisaoyu and the Kokugaku movement, and Mantokuji, the 'divorce temple'.
