## Monumenta Nipponica

Recent issues of MN have contained a wide variety of articles about Japanese culture. They include studies on swordsmanship in the Edo period, the enthronement rites, the skull ritual in the Tachikawa sect, the excavations at Yoshinogari, Izumi Kyōka's strange stories, Nishida Kitarō and nationalism, the views of Motoori Norinaga, Tōkoku at Matsushima, and the mokkan discovered at Nara.

The journal has also run dozens of book reviews dealing with different aspects of Japanese culture—literature, religion, art, and history.

Future issues will include articles on Zen dharma transmission, Tōson's poems on war, the Ichiji Kinrin statue, rural banking in the Edo period, the emperor's role in early Shōwa, *Takamura Monogatari*, the noh play *Takasago*, Mori Arinori's draft constitution—and many more book reviews, of course.
