Recent issues have included articles on courtly fiction in the Kamakura period, medieval calligraphy, Engelbert Kaempfer, the early history of Izumo, Sōseki's *Kokoro*, village networks, Abutsu's *Utatane*, incest and rebirth in *Kojiki*, standardizing written Japanese, Kyōden's *sharebon*, and Kiseki's writings.

And last year the journal published more than sixty book reviews written by an international panel of specialists.

This year's issues feature the tragic story of Watanabe Kazan, the rags-to-riches story *Monogusa Tarō*, medieval evangelism, the Fujinoki Tomb, Satō Haruo's poetry, *sekkyō-bushi*, glosses in Japanese literature, the *philosophes* and Japan's religions. And, of course, more reviews.
