



RENNYO SHŌNIN

Rennyo (1415-1499) was the eighth head priest of the Honganji Temple of the Jōdo Shin sect, which recognizes Shinran (1173-1262) as its founder. Within the Honganji, Rennyo is revered as the restorer of Shinran's teaching; under Rennyo's leadership the Honganji emerged as the most widespread and powerful religious movement in medieval Japan.

According to an inscription on the reverse of the painting, this portrait depicts Rennyo at the age of seventy-seven, and was given by Rennyo to a disciple named Kyōjō. The upper half of the original painting also contains a portrait of sect founder Shinran.
