LAST year MN published a wide variety of articles, including studies on Dōgen and the Daruma-shū, land surveying in the Edo period, Sōgi's *Shirakawa Kikō*, the Fujinoki Tomb, medieval short stories, the Kingyoku poetry contest, Nishida Kitarō's explanation of beauty, the Divine Boy in art, Zeami's theory of acting, Tameie's *Eiga no Ittei*, and Motoori Norinaga's *Uiyamabumi*.

THE journal also ran some forty reviews of books dealing with various aspects of Japanese culture.

THIS year MN will include studies on an unpublished letter written by Uchimura Kanzō, Norinaga's *Tamakushige*, policing the provinces in the Heian period, the stories of Ejima Kiseki, Kaempfer's description of Japan, medieval calligraphy, and Kyōden's witty *sharebon*.
