Recent issues of MN have featured a wide variety of articles dealing with Korean embassies to Edo, post stations along the Gokaidō, excavations of the Fujinoki tomb, the Daruma-shū and Dōgen, the Divine Boy in Japanese art, Miyazawa Kenji's poetry, and Go-Shirakawa's craze for *imayō* songs.

The journal also published an extensive selection of reviews, assessing recent publications on Japanese culture.

Articles in forthcoming issues discuss land surveying in the Tokugawa period, Motoori Norinaga's advice on how and what to study, Sōgi's *Shirakawa Kikō*, medieval didactic stories, recent Soviet studies on Japanese literature, Taira no Kiyomori and Kamo no Chōmei in *Jikkinshō*, and the Kingyoku poetry contest. And, of course, more book reviews.
