Recent issues of MN have featured a wide variety of articles dealing with Korean embassies to Edo, post stations along the Gokaidō, excavations of the Fujinoki tomb, the Daruma-shū and Dōgen, the Divine Boy in Japanese art, Miyazawa Kenji's poetry, and Go-Shirakawa's craze for *imayō* songs.

The journal also published an extensive selection of reviews, assessing recent publications on Japanese culture.

A rticles in forthcoming issues discuss land Surveying in the Tokugawa period, Motoori Norinaga's advice on how and what to study, Sōgi's *Shirakawa Kikō*, medieval didactic stories, recent Soviet studies on Japanese literature, Taira no Kiyomori and Kamo no Chōmei in *Jikkinshō*, and the Kingyoku poetry contest.
