Monumenta *Nipponica*

So far this year MN has published a wide variety of articles on the *danka* system of temples, forging medieval documents, the introduction of songs into Meiji schools, Japanese 'howling' music, Taoka Reiun's campaign against Westernization, the latest news of the excavations at Yamadadera, the poetic treatise *Tamekanekeyō Wakashō*, and Tsunayoshi's Laws of Compassion.

In addition twenty-five books on Japanese culture have been described and assessed by specialist reviewers.

Future issues will include studies on a Shōtoku legend, the decline of the *shōen* system, Saikaku's *Yorozu no Fumihōgu*, early *dengaku*, temple names, and the transfer of the capital from Nara. Plus more reviews and an index of the first 40 volumes of MN.
