Monumenta Nipponica

LAST year's MN was Volume 37 and ran to a total of 555 pages—seventy pages longer than the previous year's and also the bulkiest since Volume 3 way back in 1940.

IT included a wide variety of articles on things Japanese, such as Kaneko Kentarō, *Nishiyama Monogatari*, Christian authors in Japan, Zeami, modern political history, the Meiji Restoration, *Utsuho Monogatari*, early missions to China, *Kasuga Ryūjin*, and poetry contests—plus 28 book reviews.

FORTHCOMING attractions include articles on an unpublished and irreverent story by Matsudaira Sadanobu, *Madame Butterfly* on the *bunraku* stage, the Buddhist scholar Inoue Enryō, a famed *rakugo* artist named Henry Black, and movements to simplify the Japanese writing system—also coverage of recently published books, of course.

MN is published regularly four times a year, and an annual subscription costs \$16.00 or ¥4,000.
