# Monumenta Nipponica

AST year MN published a wide variety of articles, including studies on Zeami's final legacy, the law primer Sata Mirensho, narrative voice in Genji Monogatari, Mujū Ichien's Tsuma Kagami (1300), translations of Tanizaki's works, the noh Seiganji, Mori Ōgai, personal poetry collections, Jogaku Zasshi, the kyōgen Suehirogari, and Shikitei Samba's account of the Edo theater.

In addition, volume xxxv also contained more than forty reviews of books dealing with different aspects of Japanese culture.

HIS year MN subscribers will read about otogi-zōshi and nara-ehon, a yamabushi pilgrimage, Rennyo and Jōdo Shinshū, and Hirata Atsutane's use of Jesuit sources. And the usual selection of book reviews, of course. A monograph on Muromachi bakufu law will also be published.
