# Monumenta Nipponica

So far this year, MN, now in its 35th volume, has published a wide variety of articles about Japanese culture. These have included studies on Mori Ōgai's Vita Sexualis, an 1811 assessment of kabuki audiences, narrative illustrations in medieval scrolls, a kyōgen titled Suehirogari, foreign policy in the last fifteen years of the Tokugawa period, Zeami's final instructions for the master actor, a Buddhist tract called Mirror for Women (1300), and an illustrated chigo monogatari.

In addition, there have been a score of book reviews and two long review articles, written by specialists in Japanese studies and dealing with subjects that range from literature and theater to history and sociology.

Collections, the history of the magazine Jogaku Zasshi, narrative voice in Genji Monogatari, the reception of Chinese painting models in Muromachi Japan, a 14th-century law primer titled Sata Mirensho, prose works by the eccentric monk Ikkyū, and two short pieces by Tanizaki Jun'ichirō. Plus, of course, the usual survey of recently published books on things Japanese.

MN is published regularly four times a year, and an annual subscription costs \$16.00 or \$4,000.
