Fujiwara Teika's

A Complete Translation, with Introduction
and Commentary, by Robert H. Brower

In the summer of 1200, Ex-Emperor Go-Toba commissioned a score of poets to compose sets of a hundred poems. To his dismay the 38-year-old Fujiwara Teika was not invited to participate, and it was only after much intercession had been made on his behalf that his name was added to the list. The result was Teika's *Hundred-Poem Sequence of the Shōji Era*, a composition which contains some of the famous poet's best poems and won for him imperial favor.

Professor Brower first published this introduction and translation in *Monumenta Nipponica* in 1976. He describes the rivalries behind Teika's nomination, outlines the development of poetic sequences, presents an annotated translation of Teika's hundred poems, and also discusses the holograph fragment which was shown to the public for the first time in the summer of 1977.
